Committee Background

"Avatar: The Last Airbender" is an animated television series that first aired from 2005 to 2008. It was created by Bryan Konietzko and Michael Dante DiMartino and has since become a beloved and influential show. Set in a world where certain individuals can manipulate the elements—water, earth, fire, and air—the story follows the journey of Aang, the last surviving Airbender and the Avatar, a being capable of mastering all four elements. The series takes place in a world divided into four nations, each corresponding to one of the elements. The Fire Nation, led by the tyrannical Fire Lord Ozai, seeks to conquer and dominate the other nations. The Avatar's role is to maintain peace and balance among the nations, but Aang disappeared a century ago, leaving the world vulnerable to the Fire Nation's aggression.

Topic B: Fire Nation Resurrectionists

Background

As seen at the beginning of book 3, Aang's group goes undercover in the fire nation.

Aang impersonates a student and from his experience it is obvious that a good amount of Fire

Nation Natives believe to be above others. Despite the Fire Nation's defeat and the dethroning of

Fire Lord Ozai, there may still be individuals and groups who cling to the ideology of Fire

Nation superiority and domination. These Resurrectionists believe in resurrecting the power and
glory of the Fire Nation, seeking to revive the nation's oppressive regime and regain control over
the other nations.

The war resulted in significant loss of life, displacement, and suffering for many individuals and communities. Some Fire Nation citizens or military personnel who harbor deep resentment and a desire for vengeance may join or form Resurrectionist groups. They may see the defeat as a temporary setback and seek to restore the Fire Nation's power to exact revenge on those they hold responsible for their suffering.

The collapse of the Fire Nation's ruling regime created a power vacuum, leaving room for opportunistic individuals or factions to rise and attempt to seize control. The Resurrectionists may exploit the chaos and instability following the war to gain influence and rally supporters who yearn for a return to the old ways.

Current Situation

Even though the 4 nations are in harmony now, there are still supporters of what the Fire Nation did during the war. The establishment of the United Republic of Nations, aimed at fostering harmony and cooperation among the nations, may not sit well with everyone. Some Fire Nation citizens may feel marginalized or disenchanted with the new order and join

Resurrectionist movements as a means of opposing what they perceive as an infringement on their rights or a diminishing of their nation's influence. The goal of the Fire Nation Rebellion Squad (FNRS) is to assassinate Fire Lord Zuko and reconquer the rest of the world.
